Warner Southern College, founded in 1968 by the Southeastern Association of the Church of God (Anderson, Indiana), is a co-educational, Christian college in the liberal arts tradition wherein the study of religion, the arts, sciences, literature, languages and mathematics, and related subjects may be taught and advanced.

Only two presidents have led WSC. Dr. Leroy Fulton was the first president. Dr. Gregory V. Hall has led Warner Southern as its second president since 1991.

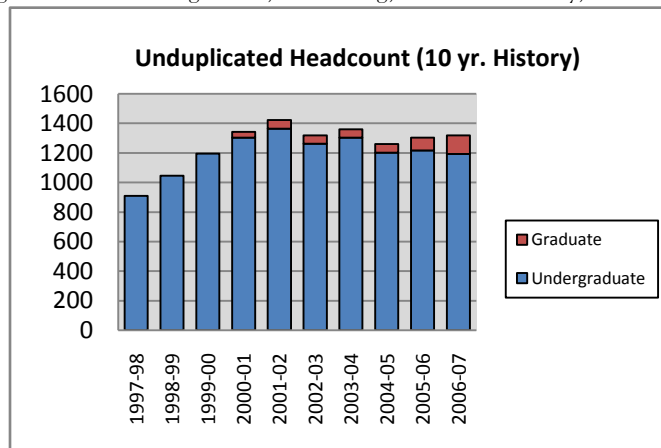
